Our group homes provide a family environment for children, ages 6-17, who have moderate-to-severe disabilities and may be medically fragile. All of our homes are specially designed to meet the unique needs of our residents. We offer structured programming that helps residents learn basic life skills and provide them with opportunities to participate in therapeutic recreational activities and community-based outings—maximizing their potential and increasing their community integration.

- Licensed by the California Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing
- Regional Center vendored, able to accept residents from any California Regional Center
- Comfortable living for up to six residents per home
- Low 1:2 staff-to-resident ratio
- Environment and highly-trained staff that meet residents' special medical and developmental needs
- In-house medical/psychiatric support team
- Person Centered Thinking model of support
- Use of Wayfinder's on-campus services and amenities, including our Special Education School, a medical office staffed 24-hours per day, fitness room and gymnasium, Mattel Park sensory playground and swimming pool
- Regular visiting hours and home visits
- Comprehensive case management that includes and supports families
- Family camp sessions at our Camp Bloomfield program
