Wayfinder's special education school is a California state-certified non-public school that provides children and youth, ages 5-21, who have moderate-to-severe disabilities, with a safe and nurturing environment for learning and growth. Through individualized educational programming, our students learn life skills to develop a positive self-image and increase independence.

AT A GLANCE

- Individualized instruction on communication, functional academics, self-help, socialization and prevocational skills
- Compassionate teachers credentialed to work with children who have severe disabilities
- 1:2 staff-to-student ratio
- Large classrooms with adapted instructional materials to engage all students in learning activities
- Designated instructional service for speech and language, occupational therapy, physical therapy, orientation and mobility and visual impairment services
- On-site nursing services
- Outdoor recreation, including our sensory playground and swimming pool
- Instructional outings in the community to promote socialization skills and transition skills
- Parent events, school-wide events for students and families, parent advocacy board and meetings to enrich our program
- Specialized services for students whose disabilities include visual impairment, such as orientation and mobility training, assistive technology instruction and lessons in pre-Braille

Please note, visual impairment is not a prerequisite for enrollment. We serve children from school districts throughout Los Angeles County and surrounding areas. Students do not need to live in Los Angeles County to attend.
